The following is a bibliography of articles published in the *New York Times* concerning the Boy Scouts of America (BSA). Until the BSA National Council moved their national office to Texas in 1980, their offices had been in the New York City area since 1911. For a majority of that time, the national offices were on Park Avenue in New York City. Consequently, the BSA took advantage of their location and the free publicity the press provided, especially during its important formative years.

The bibliography is not organized by subject areas at the present time. Articles are arranged chronologically by year, then by date, then by article title.
