Alpha Phi Omega

I have not come across many publications regarding the APO fraternity. Consequently, those archives that contain APO source material are listed below.

Alpha Phi Omega (Michigan State University Chapter). *Collection*. Michigan State University. East Lansing, MI. Contents: Records of Alpha Phi Omega Fraternity consist of two copies of a booklet entitled THE CAMPUS BEAUTIFUL, which contains sketches and brief descriptions and histories of Michigan State University buildings. Alpha Phi Omega. Alpha Chapter (Lafayette College). *Collection*. David Bishop Skillman Library, Lafayette College. Easton, PA. Contents: Documents the activities of the Alpha Chapter of Alpha Phi Omega, an international service fraternity founded at Lafayette College. The material documents the various activities of the fraternity: its founding in 1925 by Frank Reed Horton, its affiliation with and public endorsement by the Boy Scouts of America, its various college and community service activities, and the initiation of women into the fraternity in 1974. Of particular interest are photographs of Alpha Chapter activities and national pilgrimages spanning 1952-1982. Alpha Phi Omega. Beta Chapter (U of Pittsburgh). *Collection*. Archives Service Center, University Library System, University of Pittsburgh. Pittsburgh, PA. Contents: This collection contains documents relating to both the Beta chapter of Alpha Phi Omega and the national fraternity. Chapter records include by-laws, membership lists, general brother and executive meeting minutes, correspondence with other chapters, letters from national fraternity staff, and chapter project information from the late 1970s and 1990-2007. Representative samples of some of the Beta chapter's fraternity awards are also present. National fraternity records include publications

regarding Alpha Phi Omega's history, officer handbooks, by-laws, and information regarding national conventions. Alpha Phi Omega. Beta Sigma Chapter (Texas Tech University Chapter). *Collection*. Southwest Collection/Special Collections Library, Texas Tech University. Lubbock, TX. Contents: Organized on the Texas Technological College campus as the Eagle Scout Club in the fall of 1938, the club officially became the Beta Sigma Chapter on April 30, 1939. A service organization, APO is a national service fraternity affiliated with the Boys Scouts of America. The chapter was recognized in 1942 for having the nation's largest pledging class. Service projects have included placing benches across campus, helping conduct student elections and the Carol of Lights events, planning homecoming activities, sponsoring a Cub Scout den for handicapped students at Ballinger School, and establishing an endowment fund through the sale of football games. In 1976, the organization became co-ed and has been involved in community projects for the Lubbock State School, the Adopt-a-City project, Habitat for Humanity, and the South Plains Food Bank. Alpha Phi Omega. Gamma Pi Chapter (University of Michigan). *Collection*. Bentley Historical Library, University of Michigan. Ann Arbor, MI. Contents: Minute books, officer's reports, correspondence, records of service projects, publications, scrapbooks and photographs.

Alpha Phi Omega. Tau Chapter (University of Florida). *Collection*. Special and Area Studies Collections, George A. Smathers Libraries, University of Florida. Gainesville, FL. Contents: The Tau Chapter of the University of Florida was founded in 1931 by Andrew R. Janson and W.G. Perry. Hibbs, Thomas J. *Collection*. Minnesota Historical Society. St. Paul, MN. Contents: Personal papers related to the life and volunteer work of Thomas J. Hibbs, Jr., a prominent figure in the Minneapolis African American community, and his mother, Florence Davis Hibbs Daniels, a singer and minister in Chicago and Minneapolis. Hibbs was born October 7th, 1919 in Alexandria, Minnesota. Hibbs and his father, Thomas Hibbs, Sr. and his mother were one of only two black families in Alexandria at that time. Thomas Sr. made his living as a caretaker for a Catholic church building and ran a shoe shine parlor. The family moved to St. Cloud in the 1920s, when Thomas Sr. was asked to take over the care of some church buildings there. Thomas Jr. attended grade school in Alexandria and at St. Mary's School in St. Cloud. After his father passed away in 1935, Hibbs's mother enrolled him in St. John's preparatory school. After an unsuccessful year at another preparatory school in Alabama, Hibbs spent his senior year at the new high school at Father Flanagan's Boys' Home in Boys Town, Nebraska. After completing military service in Virginia, he attended Globe College of Business and the University of Minnesota's General College. He went on to a career in the dry cleaning business. Hibbs worked with many different service, religious, and social organizations, but greatest passion was work with youth. Beginning as a youth, he was particularly involved with scouting and eventually become an Eagle Scout. During his military service in Virginia during the 1940s he volunteered as a Boy Scout organizer, serving as a district commissioner for the Robert E. Lee Council. Also worked with the Boys'

Club of Minneapolis and as an advisor for Alpha Phi Omega, a national service fraternity he initially joined as a student at the University of Minnesota. Date: 1921-1996.

Lewis, Andrew Jackson, and Edward Randolph Carter. *Collection*. Archives Division, Auburn Avenue Research Library on African-American Culture and History, Atlanta-Fulton Public Library System. Atlanta, GA. Contents: The collection consists of papers of Edward Randolph Carter and Andrew Jackson Lewis from CA 1890-1985. The papers include correspondence, printed material, photographs, financial records, clippings, a diary (1942) documenting Lewis' military service during World War II, and ephemera. Early materials (1905-1942) pertain to Carter's religious activities and duties as pastor of Friendship Baptist Church (Atlanta, Ga.) and also include writings and sermons of Carter. The bulk of the collection (1944-1985) pertains to Andrew J. Lewis and documents his involvement with Boy Scout troops in Atlanta (Ga.), as an educator and principal in the Atlanta school system, with state and national teachers' or educational associations, and the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity. The collection also contains materials relating to Friendship Baptist Church including correspondence (1942-1983), financial reports, annual reports (1943, 1978-1985), and programs.
